Stones will play 100th show at Gillette

The Rolling Stones are kicking off the 2024 concert series at Gillette Stadium next Thursday, May 20. The Stones launched the U.S. leg of their Hackney Diamonds tour April 28 in Houston and are stopping in Foxboro for one night. The Gillette show will mark the 100th concert in the venue's history. And as it happens, the Stones also headlined Gillette's inaugural concert on Sept. 5, 2000. Of the 30-plus headlining acts, the ones with the most shows are Kenny Chesney (who will perform his 22nd, 23rd and 24th shows this summer), Taylor Swift (13 shows), Bruce Springsteen and The E Street Band (seven shows) and Ed Sheeran (seven performances, five as a headliner). More than 5 million fans have attended Gillette shows to date, their media people say. For ticket info, go to gillettestadium.com.
